# MERIT AWARD PROGRAM GUIDELINES

Together, the American Simmental Association and the American Simmental/Simbrah Foundation support this Merit Award Scholarship Program each year. The four award levels are outlined below:

#### 1. ACHIEVEMENT AWARD (Certificate)

- a. For ASA juniors and non-members
- b. Recognizes achievement in 4-H or FFA beef projects (Simmental/Simbrah)
- c. No application required
- d. Selected by 4-H and FFA leaders
- e. Presented at local programs
- f. Unlimited number of awards
- g. Contact the ASA office with the number of awards to be presented and we will mail the achievement certificates to you. ASA Junior members do not need to be an Achievement Award winner in order to apply for the Bronze Merit Award.

#### 2. BRONZE (Certificate and Bronze Lapel Pin)

- a. For ASA junior members
- b. Recognizes achievement in Association sponsored Simmental/Simbrah activities
- c. Application and two (2) letters of recommendation required
- d. Selected by state association (state association sets the deadline date)
- e. Presented at annual state association meeting or appropriate event throughout the year
- f. Unlimited number of awards/state/year
- g. One-time award per individual
- h. Completed application and recommendation letters should be sent to your State Association President. If there is not a state association, send all information to AJSA via email at ajsa@simmgene.com. The state selection committee should provide ASA with the following information for all award recipients: Name of individual(s) (correct spelling please), ASA Membership Number and Date the award will be presented. The achievement certificates will be printed with the above information. Please be sure to notify us well in advance so that the certificates can be printed in time for your awards ceremony.
- i. All state associations and juniors outside of an active state association must submit all required information along with the application by JUNE 1.

#### 3. SILVER (Certificate and \$2,000 Scholarship)

- a. <u>Selected from among previous Bronze Award winners by a committee</u>
- b. For ASA junior members who are at least 16 years of age by January 1 of the year of application
- c. Recognizes achievement in Association sponsored Simmental/Simbrah activities
- d. Application and two (2) letters of recommendation required
- e. Presented at National Classic
- f. Maximum of 12 awards per year
- g. One-time award per individual
- h. Completed application, recommendation letters and recent photo (head & shoulders) must be submitted to ajsa@simmgene.com NO LATER THAN MAY 25.

### 4. GOLD (Certificate and \$4,000 Scholarship)

- a. <u>Selected from among previous Silver Award winners by a committee</u>
- b. For ASA junior members who are at least 16 years of age by January 1 of year of application
- c. Recognizes achievement in Association sponsored Simmental/Simbrah activities
- d. Application and three (3) letters of recommendation required
  - i. One letter must be from a State (senior) Association Officer
- e. Presented at National Classic
- f. Maximum of five awards per year
- g. One-time award per individual
- h. Completed application, recommendation letters and recent photo (head & shoulders) must be submitted to ajsa@simmgene.com NO LATER THAN MAY 25.

Silver and Gold Award Certificates are presented to the winners at the National Classic each year. However, the actual scholarship money is not awarded until the recipient has registered and paid tuition to attend a postsecondary institution. At that time, the recipient must send proof of enrollment to the Chief Financial Officer at ASA via invoices@simmgene.com. A check will then be forwarded to the recipient.
